
The weather was perfect, as were the refreshments. It was well attended as you can see from our photo and enjoyed by all.

Light in Jury Road the street light opposite number 4 has been out for months, this is dangerous, it is very dark in that part of Jury Road, it's on a bend and the road narrows. The repair has been chased very hard and it was promised it would be fixed by the end of June as at now it is still out.

Good News Light fixed at last on 26th July
